Adjournment: There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 1:02 PM.



The MMG Library is Online for All Members to Enjoy

The following is a repeat of instructions for accessing materials in the MMG Library. Our library is for all to enjoy and I hope that you will consider checking out a book or magazine in the near future. I will also continue to bring materials to our meetings that you might want to check out. Sue Taylor, Librarian

The MMG research library is available to any MMG member in good standing. A complete inventory of the books in the MMG library is posted online, as well as an inventory of the magazines in the collection. There are 3 inventories of the books: one listed alphabetically by title, one listed alphabetically by author, and one listed by subject. All three listings have the publication year and a general description of the book. The magazine inventory is alphabetical by magazine title, with a listing of issues we currently have. All 4 lists are downloadable for your convenience and are also printable if you want to make a hard copy.

How to Access Inventories and Request Materials

To access the inventory lists, go to the MMG website at https://midwestminiatureguild.org, left click on the "Resources" category on the header bar located under the MMG logo. (See Figure)



The 4 inventories are listed there. Left click once on whichever one you want to open.

To download a list, left click once on the downward pointing arrow located near the top right of the page. To print the inventory, left click once on the small printer icon also located in the top right corner of the page. (See Figure)

If you download and save one of the inventories as a pdf and you would like to search for a topic, you may follow this procedure. Open the downloaded pdf in Adobe Reader (not in browser), display the search/find window pane by using Ctrl+F. Type in topic, such as wicker, then enter. The first topic in inventory will be highlighted. To go to the next item of topic select "Next" button. (See Figure)



To have specific materials pulled for you, email the librarian at <u>Librarian4MMG@gmail.com</u> with the book title and author, or the magazine title and issue # or month. Requested items will be brought to the next MMG meeting for pick up at the library table. Borrowed items should be returned to the librarian at the next MMG meeting.

We are continually looking for donations of books and magazines related to miniatures and dollhouses that can be added to the permanent MMG Research Library. Please bring any donated materials to the MMG Library table at the next meeting. Thank you!

MAY CENTERPIECES

I asked Shell Domko to write up her process and a description of the wonderful centerpieces she created for our May Guild meeting. She obliged me and so we receive a fantastic look into her process. I am sure we can agree that she is a very talented miniaturist.

"The centerpieces were designed to look like a storybook on the outside, meant to represent the story that the guild has built together over the last 40 years, with a cozy sitting room on the inside. Hidden in the bookshelf are little items that miniature builders spend their time creating. There are intentionally a few open spaces on the shelves so more things could be added if wanted. If you look closely, you will find:


- Model train
- Model of a Tardis (from Doctor Who)
- A first place miniature trophy
- Dollhouse
- Historical model building
- Book nook

- Fairy house/garden
- Model ship
- Miniature hot air balloon hanging on the opposite wall (my signature addition)

On the little table next to the chair, you will find two magazines. The first is a "Nutshell News" from 1984 and the second is a "Dollhouse Miniatures" from 2024 to signify the 40 years the guild has been around.

I designed the main piece and many of the elements myself, using a laser cutter and a 3D printer to make them a reality. I used scrapbook paper for the wallpaper, thinned paint for stain and hand painted the knickknacks. To add a "magical" element to the piece, I created a battery powered flickering fireplace with a magnetic switch that turns on when a small pillar candle is placed on the mantle in just the right spot. To furnish the room, I made custom upholstered chairs, crocheted tiny blankets, and then made little braided rugs to tie the whole room together.

Below is one of my favorite centerpieces (they were all a little different with different color schemes)."

Good idea, huh!"

I was looking for small "fancy" wood to make some miniature charcuterie boards. Online, I found something called "Zebrawood". Locally, Rockler Woodworking and Hardware looked like a good prospect. Rockler has several Twin Cities locations. The location near Ridgedale was closest to me. (One in Burnsville!)

Rockler had exactly the type of wood I needed and it was thin enough to work for miniatures. An additional bonus was their scrap wood box. There I found additional thin pieces perfect for miniatures - at a fraction of the cost! You had to dig in the big box but it was well worth the exercise.


